Further to your correspondence, the Draft Regional Spatial Strategy (RSS) for the South West has been produced by the South West Regional Assembly - a partnership of Councillors from all local authorities in the region and representatives of various sectors with a role in the region's economic, social and environmental well-being. The Assembly is the Regional Planning Body and, as such, has worked with a wide range of partners and stakeholders to prepare the Draft RSS.

The South West Regional Assembly submitted the Draft RSS for the South West 2006-2026 to Government on 24th April 2006. Consultation on behalf of the Independent Panel of Inspectors will run for 12 weeks from **6th June 2006 to 30th August 2006, closing at 5pm.**

Chapter 8, page 178 - Policy E2: Identification of Employment Sites

3rd sentence should read: *'Outside of SSCTs, LDDs should give preference (having regard to the sequential test) firstly to land within ~~the SSCTs~~ **those places** identified through the application of Development Policy B and then outside these places to previously developed land which is well integrated with the existing settlement pattern.'*
